UPA is Hosting The "Africa Health Excon" Closing Ceremony at The Base of The Pyramids

The Egyptian Authority for Unified Procurement, Medical Supply and Technology Management (UPA) orchestrated a monumental ceremony at the base of the pyramids, a testament to the resounding success of the third edition of the African Health ExCon. This edition was graced with the unwavering support of H.E. President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi and was inaugurated by H.E. Prime Minister, Dr. Mostafa Madbouly. Major General Dr. Bahaa El-Din Zidan, Chairman of The Egyptian Authority for Unified Procurement, Medical Supply and Technology Management (UPA), expressed his gratitude to all the parties supporting the exhibition. He noted that the current edition is the largest in the exhibition's history across its three sessions. Zidan said, "The authority's celebration at the pyramids area was to honor the historical and cultural contributions of the ancient Egyptians, who were the first to teach humanity the meaning of health care and medicine. Their monuments and inscriptions still witness the medical innovations they shared with the world, immortalized in the surgical instrument panel at the Temple of Kom Ombo in the Nile Valley." He added, "The current session of the exhibition reflects the continuation of that vision from the past into the future, especially with the unprecedented support for the health and pharmaceutical sector and the directives of the political leadership towards localizing medical services and the pharmaceutical industry in Egypt during this historical stage of building the new republic." Dr. Kamal Obaid, Executive Director of the Africa Health ExCon, emphasized the uniqueness of the current edition, which spanned 10,000 square meters and featured participation from 100 countries. It included over 1,200 Egyptian speakers and 150 international speakers and hosted 350 sessions and 26 workshops with contributions from 368 exhibitors. He continued, 'The exhibition witnessed the signing of numerous memorandums of understanding and protocols, a testament to the event's impact on developing Egypt's health system and exporting medical and health services to many countries across the continent. Additionally, partnerships with major international companies were announced to manufacture strategic medical equipment in Egypt, a significant step towards enhancing the health system in Egypt and providing future generations with the highest levels of health care."



Nevine El-Kabbaj: Conditional Social Protection Programs Guarantee Access to Healthcare for The Lowest-Income Groups

Nevine El-Kabbaj, Minister of Social Solidarity, participated in the conference's concluding day activities, focusing on the significance of safeguarding women's health. She emphasized that Egypt's Ministry of Social Solidarity integrates healthcare within its specialized social protection framework and programs to address multidimensional poverty. These programs encompass education, health, housing, and nutrition. She mentioned that the Ministry's programs encompass around 5 million families, with %52 of cash assistance recipients being women. The cash support programs include conditional protection initiatives like "Takaful," which directly involves health check-ups, vaccinations, and health education sessions.






This approach ensures heightened awareness and improved health outcomes, benefiting lower-income groups. In her speech, she added, "The Ministry also prioritizes reproductive and maternal health by offering free family planning resources, maternal healthcare services, and early detection programs for diseases like breast and cervical cancer, particularly targeting rural areas with limited access to healthcare." The Minister highlighted the importance of collaboration with non-governmental organizations, as nearly 12,000 NGOs deliver between 30 and %32 of health services, particularly in reproductive health and cancer care. Despite these efforts, she noted challenges persist, including cultural barriers, data accuracy, digital transformation, and financing. Addressing these issues necessitates a comprehensive and interconnected social protection mechanism.




The Egyptian Authority for Unified Procurement, Medical Supply and Technology Management (UPA) and the Union of Arab Pharmacists Signed a Cooperation Protocol During "Africa Health Excon"

Africa Health ExCon featured the signing of a cooperation protocol between the Egyptian Authority for Unified Procurement, Medical Supply and Technology Management (UPA) and the Union of Arab Pharmacists. The agreement entails that the Union of Arab Pharmacists obtains medical



contracts from Arab and African countries, representing their medicines and medical supplies requirements. These contracts will be implemented through the Egyptian Authority for Unified Procurement via supply orders, as stipulated in the agreement signed by both parties. The protocol was signed by Dr. Hisham Stit, Vice President of the Egyptian Authority for Unified Procurement, Medical Supply and Technology Management (UPA), mentioned in this agreement, and Dr. Ali Muhammad Ibrahim, serving as General Secretary of the Union of Arab Pharmacists.



The Egyptian Authority for Unified Procurement, Medical Supply, and Technology Management (UPA) Renewed the Cooperation contract with the Zambia Medicine and Medical Supplies Agency.

The Egyptian Authority for Unified Procurement, Medical Supply, and Technology Management (UPA) signed a contract to renew its cooperation with the Zambia Medicine and Medical Supplies Agency. The signing occurred in the presence of Dr. Victor Nyasulu, the agency's Director General, and Brigadier Hatem Salah, Director General of Contracts at UPA.

The Chairman of the Pharmaceutical Authority welcomed the Chairman of the Directorate of Pharmacy, Medicines, and Traditional Medicine of the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

Today, Dr. Ali Al-Ghamrawi, Chairman of the Egyptian Drugs Authority, met with Dr. Christian Ntumba, President of the Congolese Pharmaceutical Regulatory Authority (ACOREP), in the presence of several leaders from the Authority. The meeting focused on investment opportunities in the pharmaceutical sector in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, as outlined in the memorandum of understanding signed between the two sides in 2023. They also reviewed the progress of the memorandum of understanding and discussed various aspects of cooperation related to pharmaceutical affairs, supervision, and regulation processes. This effort is part of the Authority's ongoing commitment to strengthen collaboration with counterpart entities in sister African countries. It is rooted in its regional leadership role and aims to support endeavors that facilitate the entry of Egyptian pharmaceutical products into African markets. This includes backing investments to meet the pharmaceutical needs of these markets.
